OLD BUSINESS:

- 6. G. Holt indicated that a town resident is willing to donate an energy meter to the E Com. He will follow-up on the donation.
- 7. The Committee discussed improving our town web site. G. Holt and L. Richmond offered to develop template for additional pages. A goal would be to provide useful, energy-related links other web pages. Links would be discussed and vetted by the Committee at our monthly public meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 2. Funding sources for energy conservation and sustainable energy projects are anticipated from the NH Public Utilities Commission (PUC). The E Com will track progress of grant and loan monies which will be administered by the PUC.
- Members of the E Com expressed interest in evaluation sustainable energy sources for the Town buildings. Further evaluation of potentially applicable sustainable energy sources is a long-term goal.
